



CLBC Eligibility- Information for Families

Next Steps:

1. Your family member has met the criteria to receive CLBC services. To receive CLBC services your family member must be 19 years of age or older, but they may apply for eligibility after their 16th birthday.
2. CLBC staff will contact you and your family member and talk about next steps, timelines and future possibilities.

Criteria for Eligibility

Eligibility for CLBC services is determined by a qualified Registered Psychologist or Certified School Psychologist.

Developmental Disability

An adult has:

- Impaired intellectual functioning
- Impaired adaptive functioning
- These impairments must have started before age 18

Personalized Supports Initiative

An adult has:

- Significant limitation in adaptive functioning,
- AND EITHER
- A diagnosis of Fetal Alcohol Spectrum (FASD)
